GOD, THE CHURCH, & THE WORLD

KAIROS is a foundational discipleship course centered around God's mission. It brings out God's heart for all the nations of the world and His desire to use His people to be a blessing to them. KAIROS emphasizes the importance of ministering to culture that still have few or no indigenous churches. KAIROS is designed to educate, inspire and challenges Christians to meaningful participation in God's heart for all the nations. It is a tool God is using to help transform the worldview of believers, so they see themselves as having been blessed in order to be a blessing to all people groups.

Format:

The KAIROS course can be conducted using several formats:

- One session per week (approximately 2.5 hrs) over nine or ten weeks
- Three weekends
- Five day intensive
- Other flexible formats to suit the needs of participants
- Total course hours: ~25 hours + ~20 hours reading and worksheets

KAIROS is available

- In person
- Online
- Hybrid -online and in person

Content:

KAIROS covers four major areas of mission concern.

- Biblical** –We discover that mission lies at the center of God's concern and that an overriding theme throughout the whole Bible is God blessing His people to be a blessing to all people groups.
- Historical** –God's mission purpose can be seen throughout history. We gain much from studying the past successes and failures of the church in the area of mission expansion.
- Strategic** –We learn about strategy and key mission strategies that bear fruit in reaching unreached people groups in today's world. Every believer and church has a significant role to play.
- Cultural** –Mission involves crossing cultures. We learn what culture is and see what it takes to communicate and make disciples in a culture different from our own.

Chapter 7 - Cross-Cultural Considerations

Purpose: To gain some understanding of what culture is, and address some of the challenges related to cross-cultural ministry.

Chapter 8 - World Christian Teamwork

Purpose: To discover that although not all are called to go cross-culturally, all are called to a vital part in world evangelization

Chapter 9 - Integration

Purpose: To recognize the importance of reflecting on what God has shown you during the Kairos course and the process of internalizing and practically outworking this in your life.
